OIG Exclusion List

If you participate in any Medicare, Medicaid, or Medicare Advantage plan, you are required to screen all employees, business associates, and subcontractors against the Office of Inspector General's (OIG) List of Excluded Individuals and Entities (LEIE) prior to hiring or contracting with them, and then continue to re-check them against the LEIE every month thereafter. Performing this monthly requirement can be very time-consuming. This service checks each employee against the LEIE and notifies you if a name appears on the list. If an employee ends up on the report, we provide instructions on how to verify that this is the actual employee listed on the LEIE. We then continue to re-check your employees against the list every month and send you a report via email.

Business Associate/ Vendor Tracking

Your account will include a section to add contact information for each of your business associates and vendors, and you will be able to upload your signed business associate agreement or confidentiality agreement for each vendor. Once you have added your business associates and vendors, we will immediately begin to check their company names against the LEIE and notify you if they appear on the exclusion list. We will then continue to check their name against the LEIE monthly and send you a report via email.

Medical Assistant Credentialing

As of January 2013, only credentialed medical assistants have been permitted to enter laboratory, medication, and radiology orders into their EHR system. In order to meet meaningful use requirements under the Medicare EHR incentive program, non-certified medical assistants must be credentialed. HCP's Medical Assistant Credentialing course was developed in September 2014 and meets the Centers for Medicare And Medicaid Services (CMS) Meaningful Use criteria found under 42 CFR Parts 170, 412, 413, and 495. Upon completion, the employee will be able to enter laboratory, medication and radiology orders into a Certified Electronic Health Record Technology (CEHRT), evaluate Clinical Decision Support (CDS) intervention, and make changes to orders based on the CDS intervention or bypass the intervention.
